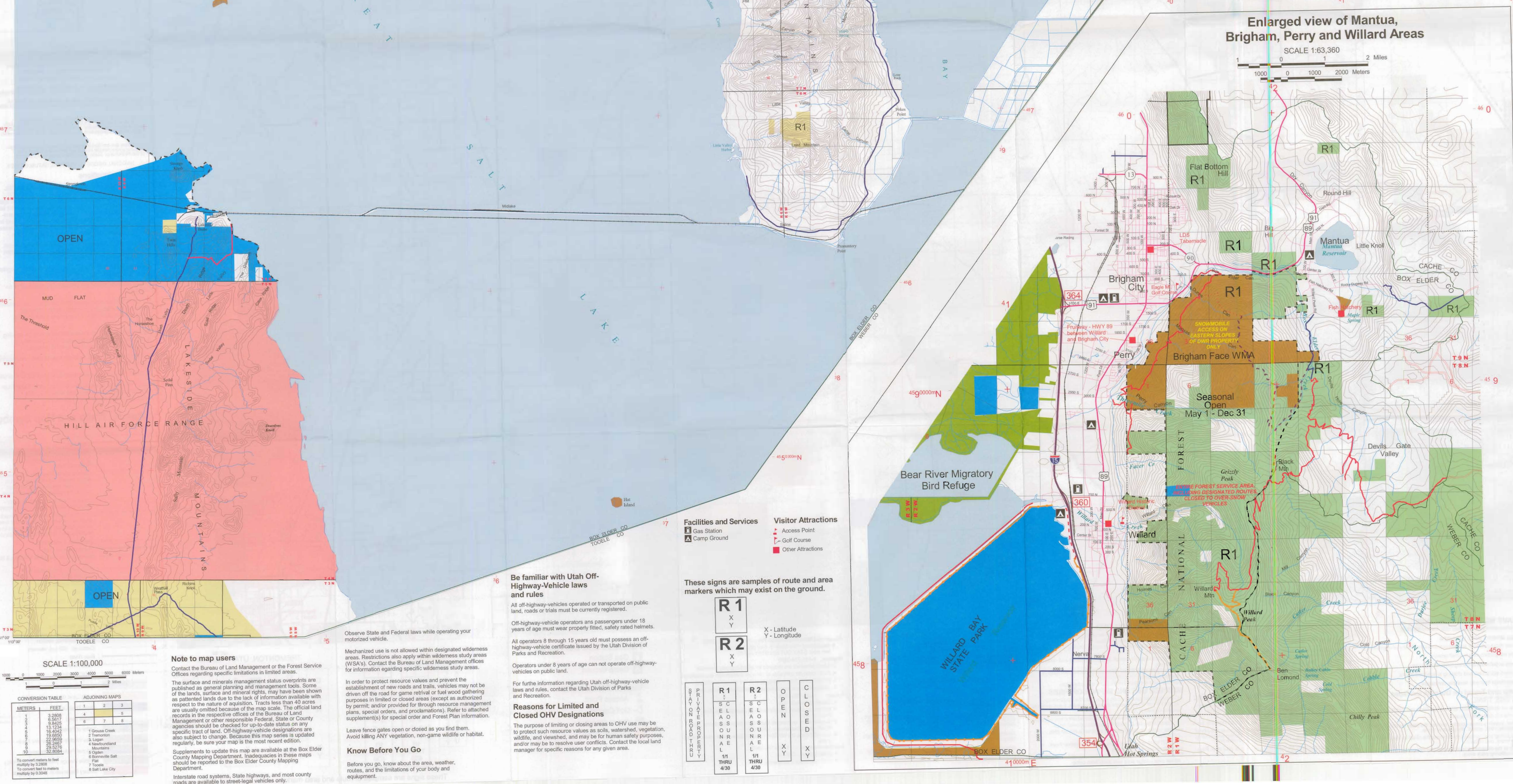

Travel Designations
This plan is part of Box Elder County Ordinance 222. Violation of Ordinance is punishable as a Class "B" Misdemeanor under Utah law. Ordinance does not apply to public employees acting within the scope of their lawful authority, or grazing and mining permits of governmental entities and public land leases whose travel is to be in accordance with their respective permits or leases. Report violation to Box Elder County Sheriff's office.
Travel through private land is limited to roads shown on the map and traveler(s) must stay on roads shown unless authorized otherwise by landowner.
Travel by motorized vehicle of any sort within the geographical areas designated on the map shall occur as follows:
OPEN AREAS: motorized vehicles may travel off or on roadways.
R1 AREAS: motorized travel shall occur only on roadways shown on the map, except cross country travel by snowmobile is authorized when ample snow cover is present.
R2 AREAS: motorized travel shall occur only on existing routes, except cross country travel by snowmobile is authorized where ample snow cover is present.
SEASONAL AREAS: no motorized travel shall occur during periods shown on map.
CLOSED AREAS: no motorized travel shall occur at anytime.
Camping on BLM lands, Forest Service lands, State Trust lands and Sovereign lands is permitted within 0.2 miles of roads authorized for motorized travel.

Note to map users
Contact the Bureau of Land Management or the Forest Service Offices regarding specific limitations in limited areas.
The surface and minerals management status overprints are published as general planning and management tools. Some of the lands, surface and mineral rights, may have been shown as patented lands due to the lack of information available with respect to the nature of acquisition. Tracts less than 40 acres are usually omitted because of the map scale. The official land records in the respective offices of the Bureau of Land Management or other responsible Federal, State or County agencies should be checked for up-to-date status on any specific tract of land. Off-highway-vehicle designations are also subject to change. Because this map series is updated regularly, be sure your map is the most recent edition.
Supplements to update this map are available at the Box Elder County Mapping Department. Inadequacies in these maps should be reported to the Box Elder County Mapping Department.
Interstate road systems, State highways, and most county roads are available to street-legal vehicles only.

Know Before You Go
Before you go, know about the area, weather, routes, and the limitations of your body and equipment.
Observe State and Federal laws while operating your motorized vehicle.
Mechanized use is not allowed within designated wilderness areas. Restrictions also apply within wilderness study areas (WSAs). Contact the Bureau of Land Management offices for information regarding specific wilderness study areas.
In order to protect resource values and prevent the establishment of new roads and trails, vehicles may not be driven off the road for game retrieval or fuel wood gathering purposes in limited or closed areas (except as authorized by permit; and/or provided for through resource management plans, special orders, and proclamations). Refer to attached supplement(s) for special order and Forest Plan information.
Leave fence gates open or closed as you find them.
Avoid killing ANY vegetation, non-game wildlife or habitat.

Be familiar with Utah Off-Highway-Vehicle laws and rules
All off-highway-vehicles operated or transported on public land, roads or trails must be currently registered.
Off-highway-vehicle operators are passengers under 18 years of age must wear properly fitted, safety rated helmets.
All operators 8 through 15 years old must possess an off-highway-vehicle certificate issued by the Utah Division of Parks and Recreation.
Operators under 8 years of age can not operate off-highway-vehicles on public land.
For further information regarding Utah off-highway-vehicle laws and rules, contact the Utah Division of Parks and Recreation.
Reasons for Limited and Closed OHV Designations
The purpose of limiting or closing areas to OHV use may be to protect such resource values as soils, watershed, vegetation, wildlife, and viewshed, and may be for human safety purposes, and/or may be to resolve user conflicts. Contact the local land manager for specific reasons for any given area.
